Sustainable Tennessee

The Sustainable Tennessee Agenda is a roadmap for policy and practice initiatives to move TN to a healthy and sustainable future for its people, places and economy. A broad coalition of citizens, conservation groups, policy experts, business, government, industry, students, educators and more meet annually to develop and implement the Agenda focused on land, air, water, energy and transportation issues.

Radioactive Waste Education Project

Tennessee is a major player when it comes to disposal of radioactive waste. Thus, with the support of a grant from the New Mexico Community Foundation, the Council is working to educate Tennesseans about our role in radioactive waste disposal in Tennessee landfills and facilities.

Watershed Support Center

The Council works with local communities to educate, conserve and restore watersheds (areas of land that drain to a particular river or water body), and protect our drinking water sources. This work includes replanting streamside forests, reducing sediment - a significant source of water pollution, and installing rain gardens to reduce flooding.



We provide communities with watershed tools, educational programs, restoration, and regulatory support. Our Duck River Opportunities Project works to protect one of the most bio-diverse river systems in the world. The Fish Habitat Restoration Initiative provides clean streams and drinking water for people and wildlife. Join us for one of our monthly volunteer outings.

Tennessee Tree Project

Tennessee Tree project has a goal of planting or caring for 1 million native trees in TN. Planting a tree is one of the single most concrete actions you can take to help clean our air, land and water.

Your business, school, church group or other organization can partner with Tennessee Environmental Council for tree planting or tree giveaway events. Non-profit groups may use the events as a fundraiser. Tree seedlings are available mid-January to mid-April, and we offer a limited number of potted trees for planting in the fall.
